Judith February is head of Idasa's South African Governance programme. She studied law at the University of Cape Town where she obtained her BA [Law] and her LIB degrees in 1991 and 1993 respectively. She was then admitted as an attorney in 1996 and practised law in Cape Town until 2000.

In 2000 she obtained her LIM in Commercial Law also from the University of Cape Town. Judith has been working at Idasa since June 2000. She has worked extensively on issues of good governance, transparency and accountability within the South African context.



Her focus at Idasa includes corruption and its impact on governance, Parliamentary oversight, Constitutional law monitoring, institutional design and general political analysis. Judith currently does consultancy work on South Africa for a New York-based group as part of their Stability Index on 25 developing countries around the world. She is also a regular contributor to ePoliticssa- Idasa's online political journal and is a regular commentator in the media on politics in SA. She has been listed in the Financial Mail's "Little Black Book" of 300 Black professionals for 2008 and is also listed in the MtN/Mail and Guardian 300 women in South Africa, released in 2008. Judith is an exco member of the Parliamentary Monitoring Group (www.pmg.org.za). In addition, she served on an ad hoc panel to evaluate the effectiveness of South Africa's Parliament and is an independent non-executive director of Coronation Fund Managers.
